



Katrina Grant a True Clubhouse Hero Thank you for your dedication...

BACK IN 2008, SHORTLY AFTER GRADUATING FROM LINCOLN COLLEGE, KATRINA GRANT WAS HIRED TO WORK AT THE EAST NEW YORK CLUBHOUSE AT 2697 ATLANTIC AVENUE. IT WAS HER FIRST EXPERIENCE WORKING IN THE CLUBHOUSE WORLD AND UNDER THE EXPERT TUTELAGE OF, THEN, CLUBHOUSE DIRECTOR BLAISE SACKETT SHE EMBRACED THE MODEL AND MADE AN IMMEDIATE IMPACT ON THE EAST NEW YORK CLUBHOUSE COMMUNITY.

KATRINA STARTED IN THE FOOD SERVICE UNIT (FSU) AND SAID THAT EXPERIENCE IMBEDDED THE IMPORTANCE OF RELATIONSHIPS THAT MATTER, THAT ARE DEVELOPED THROUGH SIDE BY SIDE WORK. SHE LATER MOVED ON TO WORK IN THE ADMINISTRATIVE SERVICE UNIT (ASU) AND CONTINUED TO WORK SIDE BY SIDE WITH CLUBHOUSE MEMBERS AND CREATE LASTING AND IMPACTFUL BONDS. KATRINA DID CLUBHOUSE MODEL TRAINING AND ADDED TO HER KNOWLEDGE OF THE CLUBHOUSE MODEL. IN 2012, DURING HURRICANE STORM SANDY KATRINA GAVE BIRTH TO HER FIRST CHILD KYLEE-ANN. IN 2014 BLAISE SACKETT LEFT THE CLUBHOUSE AND KATRINA AND MANY OTHERS APPLIED TO BE THE NEXT DIRECTOR. SHE ULTIMATELY EMERGED AS THE BEST CANDIDATE AMONG A CROWDED FIELD OF CONTENDERS AND WAS HIRED TO BECOME THE EAST NEW YORK CLUBHOUSE PROGRAM DIRECTOR.

OVER THE NEXT TEN YEARS KATRINA'S LED THE PROGRAM THROUGH MANY TWISTS AND TURNS. SHE GOT MARRIED IN 2017 TO HER LONGTIME PARTNER EL RODRIGUEZ. THEIR FAMILY HAS GROWN TO THREE WITH THE ADDITIONS OF HER SON LUPERCIO BORN IN 2014 AND RAPHAEL BORN IN 2018.

AS PROGRAM DIRECTOR KATRINA ALWAYS REMAINED POSITIVE AND MENTORED ALL OF US HERE, IN THE CLUBHOUSE, WITH HER VISION, KINDNESS, COMPASSION AND WISDOM. IT IS FAIR TO SAY THAT KATRINA HAS THE UNIQUE ABILITY TO MEET PEOPLE WHERE THEY ARE AT, NOT TO PREJUDGE PEOPLE AND TO APPLY THE PRINCIPLES OF HUMANITY TO EACH AND EVERY INTERACTION SHE HAS. DESPITE BUILDING CLOSURES, SUPPLY ISSUES, BUDGET STRUGGLES, FOOD SHORTAGES, STAFFING TRANSITIONS, LACK OF RESOURCES, A TWO-YEAR PANDEMIC AND AN EXTREMELY DELAYED BUILDING TRANSITION KATINA ALWAYS HAS MADE LEMONS FROM LEMONADE AND SHOWED US THE WAY.

IN JULY OF 2021 WE MOVED TO 980 HALSEY STREET AND USHERED IN THE GREATER HEIGHTS CLUBHOUSE ERA. DESPITE DIFFICULTIES, SHE HAS KEPT THE PROGRAM STABLE AND THRIVING. THROUGHOUT THE CITY THE GREATER HEIGHTS CLUBHOUSE IS VERY RESPECTED AND HAS A REPUTATION FOR A STANDARD OF EXTREMELY HIGH EXCELLENCE. THIS WAS REFLECTED IN OUR MOST RECENT THREE-YEAR UNCONDITIONAL CLUBHOUSE ACCREDITATION FROM CLUBHOUSE INTERNATIONAL. WHEN THE CITY CAME UP WITH A CONTROVERSIAL RFP IN 2023, SHE PARTNERED WITH BCS LEADERSHIP TO LAND A NEW TEN-YEAR CONTRACT FOR THE GREATER HEIGHTS CLUBHOUSE TO BRING US THROUGH AND INTO THE NEXT DECADE.





INTERVIEW WITH THOMAS TORRES-BY ISABELLA TAYLOR

GREATER HEIGHTS CLUBHOUSE MEMBER SPOTLIGHT: INTERVIEW WITH THOMAS TORRES INTERVIEWED BY ISABELLA CHRISTINA TAYLOR FOR THE GREATER HEIGHTS CLUBHOUSE NEWSLETTER OCTOBER 2024

ISABELLA: TELL US ABOUT YOUR CLUBHOUSE EXPERIENCE.

THOMAS: MY CLUBHOUSE EXPERIENCE HAS BEEN A LONG JOURNEY. I CAME HERE AT A TIME WHEN I WASN'T DOING MUCH FOR MYSELF AND NEEDED SUPPORT. THE CLUBHOUSE OPENED A DOOR FOR ME, PROVIDING THE SUPPORT AND MOTIVATION I NEEDED. WITH THAT HELP, I EARNED MY GED, STARTED WORKING, AND FOUND A SENSE OF FAMILY. EVEN TODAY, I COME BACK FOR THAT SAME SUPPORT, NOT JUST TO RECEIVE BUT TO GIVE BACK TO OTHERS WHO HELPED ME.

ISABELLA: CAN YOU TELL US ABOUT YOUR JOB AT BCS PROS?

THOMAS: ABSOLUTELY. I WORK AS A CERTIFIED PEER SPECIALIST. MY ROLE INVOLVES FACILITATING GROUPS, COUNSELING INDIVIDUALS, AND WORKING ALONGSIDE STAFF. I'VE BEEN WITH BCS PROS FOR ABOUT EIGHT YEARS NOW. IT DOESN'T FEEL LIKE WORK BECAUSE OF THE POSITIVE ENERGY THERE, JUST LIKE AT THE CLUBHOUSE. THAT KIND OF ATMOSPHERE PUSHES YOU TO DO MORE THAN YOU MIGHT HAVE THOUGHT POSSIBLE.

ISABELLA: HOW DID YOU FIRST GET INVOLVED IN PEER WORK?

THOMAS: I WAS INTRODUCED TO IT BY MY PSYCHIATRIST AT THE CLINIC WHERE I WAS RECEIVING COUNSELING. SHE SUGGESTED I LOOK INTO PEER ADVOCACY, SO I ATTENDED TRAINING AT THE URBAN JUSTICE CENTER. THROUGH THEIR PROGRAM AND ANOTHER CALLED HOWIE THE HARP, I DISCOVERED HOW IMPACTFUL PEER WORK COULD BE. THE CLUBHOUSE SUPPORTED ME IN THIS JOURNEY, PROVIDING OPPORTUNITIES TO DEVELOP SKILLS I NEVER IMAGINED I WOULD, LIKE PUBLIC SPEAKING AND NAVIGATING NEW CHALLENGES. EVENTUALLY, I GOT A POSITION AT BCS PROS AS AN OFFICIAL PEER SPECIALIST IN 2016, AND I'VE BEEN THERE EVER SINCE.

ISABELLA: WHAT ADVICE WOULD YOU GIVE TO AN ASPIRING PEER?

THOMAS: JUST BE YOURSELF. THAT'S THE MAGIC. AS LONG AS YOU'RE GENUINE, THINGS WORK OUT, AND YOU CAN KEEP THINGS PROFESSIONAL WHILE BEING TRUE TO YOURSELF. ALSO, REMEMBER THE RESPONSIBILITY INVOLVED; THERE ARE PEOPLE WHO RELY ON YOU FOR HOPE.

ISABELLA: WHAT WOULD YOU LIKE TO SHARE WITH THE COMMUNITY?

THOMAS: PEER ADVOCACY IS CRUCIAL—NOT ONLY FOR THE COMMUNITY BUT ALSO FOR MENTAL HEALTH AS A WHOLE. IT SHOWS THAT INDIVIDUALS WITH MENTAL ILLNESS CAN ACHIEVE SUCCESS AND THAT LABELS DON'T DEFINE OUR ABILITIES. SOCIETY OFTEN FOCUSES ON THE NEGATIVES, BUT WHEN YOU'RE IN THIS WORLD, YOU SEE WHAT PEOPLE ARE CAPABLE OF. I SEE SO MANY TALENTED INDIVIDUALS AT MY JOB, AND THEY'RE MORE THAN THEIR DIAGNOSES. IT'S ALL ABOUT THE SUPPORT SYSTEM AND FINDING PEOPLE WHO MOTIVATE YOU.

ISABELLA: ANY OTHER THOUGHTS?

THOMAS: I'M JUST GRATEFUL FOR THE CHANCE TO SHARE MY STORY. EVEN THOUGH I DON'T COME TO THE CLUBHOUSE AS OFTEN, I KNOW THE LOVE AND SUPPORT ARE ALWAYS THERE FOR ME.

THANK YOU, THOMAS, FOR SHARING YOUR JOURNEY WITH US! THIS CONVERSATION REMINDS US OF THE STRENGTH FOUND WITHIN THE CLUBHOUSE COMMUNITY AND THE POWERFUL ROLE OF PEER ADVOCACY IN CREATING MEANINGFUL CONNECTIONS AND INSPIRING PERSONAL GROWTH.





MS. DELLA INSPIRES AT CLUBHOUSE EMPLOYMENT MEETING

AT A RECENT EMPLOYMENT MEETING, MS. DELLA CAPTIVATED CLUBHOUSE MEMBERS BY SHARING HER PERSONAL JOURNEY FROM HER FIRST JOB TO WHERE SHE IS NOW. HER STORY BEGAN ON ATLANTIC AVENUE, WHERE SHE WORKED IN A KITCHEN. THROUGH HARD WORK AND PERSISTENCE, SHE EVENTUALLY CONNECTED WITH SOMEONE WHO HELPED HER FIND NEW EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITIES, DEMONSTRATING THE POWER OF RESILIENCE AND THE IMPORTANCE OF BUILDING SUPPORTIVE RELATIONSHIPS IN THE WORKPLACE.

MS. DELLA EMPHASIZED THAT, REGARDLESS OF MENTAL HEALTH CHALLENGES, ANYONE CAN ACHIEVE THEIR CAREER GOALS WITH DETERMINATION. HER MESSAGE TO THE MEMBERS WAS POWERFUL: "DON'T LET ANY CHALLENGES HOLD YOU DOWN. TELL YOURSELF, 'I CAN DO IT,' AND YOU WILL."
